



### Directions:

1. Print both pages on cardstock or photo paper.
2. Cut out both the top and bottom circles
3. Cut out the three gray notches in the top circle
4. Cut out a small cardboard square from a cereal box or other thin cardboard
5. Put the top circle on top of the bottom circle, then put the cardboard square in the center on the back (for stability)
6. Push a tack or push pin through the center circle on top all the way through the cardboard
7. Either pound the pin down sideways with a hammer, or if using a push pin, put an eraser over top. An eraser from a mechanical pencil works great.
8. Spin the top wheel to see number triads. Practice addition or subtraction facts by placing a thumb over one of the numbers.
